Throughout the year, cadets participate in several important camps such as the Annual Training Camps (ATC), which focus on physical fitness, drill practice, weapon training, obstacle courses, map reading, and first-aid. Additionally, Leadership Training Camps (LTC) are held to develop the leadership qualities of cadets through problem-solving exercises, personality development workshops, and commanding teams. The highlight for many cadets is the chance to be selected for the prestigious Republic Day Camp (RDC) in Delhi, where they participate in the Republic Day Parade and engage in cultural exchange programs.

NCC cadets at Bahra University are also actively involved in Social Service and Community Development Camps, where they engage in blood donation drives, environmental awareness campaigns, and educational programs for underprivileged children. These camps help instill a sense of social responsibility and community service among the cadets. The university also organizes Adventure Camps, including activities like trekking, rock climbing, and river rafting, which foster resilience, decision-making, and camaraderie. In addition to these specialized camps, cadets participate in regular activities such as physical training, weekly drills, and guest lectures by army veterans, which further enhance their physical fitness, discipline, and knowledge.

To further enrich the NCC experience at Bahra University, various Commanding Officers and higher-ranking officers from the 7 Himachal Pradesh (HP) Battalion have visited the campus. In addition to the hands-on training and activities, the B and C certificates that cadets earn during their time in the NCC offer significant benefits.

- **B Certificate:** This is awarded after the completion of two years of training in the NCC and involves rigorous training in various military and social service activities. Holding a B Certificate is beneficial for students as it makes them eligible for certain benefits such as:

- Preference in government jobs: Many government sectors, including defense, police, and paramilitary forces, give preference to candidates with the B Certificate.
- Exemption from physical tests: In some defense recruitment exams, cadets with a B Certificate may be exempt from certain physical fitness tests.
- Increased leadership opportunities: The B Certificate reflects the completion of foundational NCC training, signaling strong leadership potential and discipline.
- **C Certificate:** The C Certificate is awarded after the completion of three years of NCC training and involves more advanced levels of military training and leadership responsibilities. The C Certificate offers even greater advantages, including:
 - Eligibility for Officer Training: With a C Certificate, cadets can directly join the Indian Army through special officer training courses, often with an advantage in the selection process.
 - Additional Preference for Government Jobs: A C Certificate holder enjoys further preferences in the recruitment process for both government jobs and the armed forces.
 - Higher Recognition and Leadership Role: This certificate is recognized at higher levels, enhancing the cadet's chances of securing positions of leadership and responsibility within the military or civil services.

Both B and C Certificates are highly valued by employers, particularly in fields that require discipline, leadership, and a sense of national service. These certificates not only add to a cadet's resume but also provide numerous career advancement opportunities, making them an important asset for those who wish to pursue careers in the defence sector, law enforcement, or other government roles.

In essence, the NCC at Bahra University, under the guidance of the 7 HP Battalion in Shimla, provides cadets with a well-rounded experience that combines military training, community service, and adventure.
